Have we ever tried to develop systematically a list of all the staff assistants, special assistants, and other working personnel associated with the principal figures in the Watergate and Ellsberg matters? Secretaries don't talk, but eager young men do, and I have the feeling that we keep coming upon new ones. In particular, I wonder if we've ever checked out either Douglas Howlitt, who worked for a short period for Colson, or Lewis Engman, now chairman of the Federal Trade Commission, but formerly a close associate of Ehrlichman on the Domestic Council.

What I am suggesting is that we should put someone to work interviewing one or two people and getting a complete list of names then we can go ahead to check who has been and who should be interviewed.
