Plumbers Task Force Schedule.

I note that you have scheduled Baroody, Chenow and Colson for office and/or grand jury appearances and you plan to schedule [] and Ehrlichman.

This task force has a limited interest in Baroody and Chenow and of course we are vitally interested in [], Colson and Ehrlichman. Indeed, [] committed perjury before the grand jury and has admitted his perjury to me and to Silbert and Glanzer. He told [] that his perjury before the grand jury was the result of pressure. (See my interview of [].)

With respect to Baroody and Chenow I am asking that George Frampton get with you and apprise you of the information we seek from these individuals.

With respect to Colson and Ehrlichman, I urge that we have a general meeting and agree on scheduling of these individuals at a time that both your task force and mine can participate in a full interrogation covering all areas.

With respect to [], I simply ask that you coordinate his appearance with Rick Ben-Veniste and keep in mind that he has committed perjury and that we will probably want to indict him somewhere along the line.
